HEARING GOD'S VOICE

GOD SPEAKS

DOES GOD SPEAK TO ME?

Write down a time when you believe God spoke to you. How did this experience grow your faith?

One of the most important aspects of any relationship is communication. Intimacy with the Father is no different. God is always speaking. Our task as His children is to learn to tune-in and listen to the voice of God.

GOD SPEAKS THROUGH:

- His Word. A written invitation to an experiential faith.
- Through His Church. Wise counselors, pastors, teachers and friends.
- Circumstances and timing. Sometimes we experience being at the right time at the right moment, this is an aspect of God speaking.
- The Holy Spirit. The still small voice of God to our heart and mind.
- Prayer. God loves to speak to us in our quiet and uninterrupted prayer life.
- Revelatory Gifts: Prophetic, words of knowledge, discerning of the spirits.
- Silence. The testing of our faithfulness.
- Supernaturally:

Angelic	Word of God
Dreams	Prayer
Revelation	Visions
Testing	Prophets
Burning bush	Audible Voice

RECOGNIZING THE LIES

Right now, exercise your free will. Declare that you are a child of God and that from this day forward you will hear His voice.

Part of hearing God's voice is somehow tied to obedience. God will speak to you and speak even more often when He witnesses your willingness to obey His words. Our obedience accentuates His voice. The opposite is true. Our disobedience dulls His voice and eventually the enemy will drown out even the smallest whisper. We find this example all throughout the Old Testament. The Israelites are our example of a hard-hearted people who would not listen until great disaster arrived to turn them around.

Oh, how I hope as children today, we listen. WE OBEY. It's in obedience that we live our highest and best life.

TRUTH

God is speaking all the time. Write down the many ways you view God in your life.

DISCERN THE VOICES

God's voice is always kind, encouraging, hopeful and full of love. And for the most part, our internal voice comes out of a place of love also because we have the "Breath of God" within us.

When you are hearing voices of accusation, condemnation, criticism, hatred, violence, harshness and bitterness. Any of these kinds of voices are rooting in a demonic influence.

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Take those voices captive. Look at the example in Chapter six of Marching Around Jericho. There is a powerful tool there that will teach you HOW to take thoughts captive to Christ. I use this tool consistently and this tool freed me from hearing from the wrong voice.

ACTIVATION

Prayer To Activate Your Hearing:

Father, in the name of Jesus, I am desperate to hear your voice. I repent for partnering with doubt or fear or the lie that I can't hear You. I ask you to remove all blocks that keep me separated from hearing Your voice. I command the deaf and dumb spirit to leave me. Right Now. Go to Jesus and never return. And now I receive a greater anointing of the Holy Spirit to hear your voice speak to me regularly.

Lord, I ask to hear you with greater clarity and with wisdom and understanding. Open my heart, my mind, open my imagination, my ears and eyes that I will hear You speak and see what you want me to see. I know it's your heart for me to hear you always. Today, I partner with that truth and I open my spirit to the reality that I can hear you speaking all around me and within. Thank you for speaking to me. In Jesus name. AMEN
